WHAT IS THE GREEN ECONOMY?

 Reducing environmental and climate change-related risks, and seizing opportunities for sustainable long-term growth.

For Businesses:

- Commercialization
- Market Expansion
- Adoption/productivityImprovements

For Communities:

- Skills Development
- Economic Planning
- Investment Attraction
- Infrastructure Projects



INTERNATIONAL

- Many countries are working to incentivize sustainable practices.
- 140 countries have set net-zero targets
- Globally, \$1.34 trillion in clean energy investments since 2020.
- Canada is well-positioned to capture this opportunity.



UNITED STATES

• US Inflation Reduction Act, the largest climate investment in American history, is providing over \$350 billion to address domestic energy security and climate change.

• Examples:

- Clean heavy-duty vehicles
- Drought mitigation
- Energy infrastructure



CANADA

- Canadian Net-Zero Emissions
 Accountability Act commits to
 achieving net-zero emissions by
 2050.
- Since 2015, Canada announced programming of over \$110 billion toward climate action and clean growth.



GREEN PRAIRIE ECONOMY

- The Building a Green Prairie Economy Act, a Private Member's Bill from the late Honourable Jim Carr, received Royal Assent in December 2022.
- Significant engagement to develop the framework
- The Framework was tabled December 2023.

MANITOBA'S GREEN OPPORTUNITY

- Low cost, low-carbon, hydroelectric energy
- Critical minerals in Northern Manitoba
- Zero-emission heavy equipment vehicle cluster
- Trade Corridors



PRAIRIESCAN

- Engaged to develop the Building a Green Prairies Economy Framework.
- Dedicating \$100 million over three years across the Prairies to the 5 priority areas.
- Recent investments in Manitoba that contribute to a green economy:
 - \$1.6 million for the Manitoba Chamber of Commerce
 - \$10 million for NFI Group
 - \$30 million for the Arctic Gateway Group



NEXT STEPS

Investor

 Creating jobs and growth through investments and targeted initiatives using funding programs for businesses, communities, and organizations.

Convenor

Connecting key
 economic stakeholders
 and partners with
 federal departments
 and other partners, to
 drive collaboration,
 innovation, and growth.

Advisor

 Providing place-based advice and economic expertise to assist clients and partners, and advocate for Prairie interests in national policy discussions.

Pathfinder

 Helping businesses and communities navigate government economic and job creation programs and services.

- Ongoing implementation of the framework with partners, including:
 - Co-developing initiatives with federal and external partners.
 - Returning to Parliament with the first progress report in December 2025.
