




FISCAL POLICY: THE BUDGET BALANCE

Budget Balance per capita, 2021-2022







Total Federal Transfers per capita






Provincial Debt-to-GDP Ratio



Provincial Debt-to-GDP Ratio, 2021-2022





Provincial Debt-to-GDP Ratio Absolute Change, 2014-15 to 2021-22


Labour Productivity, 2022





Labour Productivity in the Mining, Oil, and Gas Industry




Nominal Value Added in the Mining, Oil, and Gas Industry as a Percentage of All Industry Nominal Value Added




AND A POOR PERFORMANCE IN THE MANUFACTURING AND NON-BUSINESS INDUSTRIES

Labour Productivity in the Non-Business Industry




VALUE-ADDED EXPORTS

Total Exports as a Percentage of Real GDP, 2021




Direct Value-Added Total Exports as a Percent of Real GDP, 2021





Fiscal Policy: The Budget Balance

Labour Productivity

Value-Added Exports

- With large budget surpluses, many experts suggest a decrease in the surplus as residents need more support
- There may be a higher need for more expenditure in the future

- Support industries that are surpassing the national average
- Support important industries that have slow growth in labour productivity, most notably manufacturing

- Incentivize production in industries with high valueadded exports
- Promote the use of inputs made in the province
